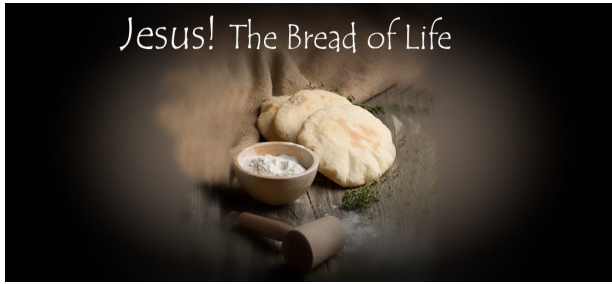

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

"Seeking True Nourishment in Christ, the Bread of Life "

Jesus! The Bread of Life



In today's Gospel for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we continue with the Bread of Life discourse from John 6. Jesus presents Himself as the living bread that came down from heaven, a message that stirred controversy and confusion among His listeners, particularly the Jews. They could not understand how Jesus, whom they knew as the son of Joseph, could claim such divine origins and offer eternal life through His flesh. This reaction highlights a common human

tendency to judge based on appearances and preconceived notions, reflecting a deeper spiritual blindness that prevents us from recognizing God's work and presence in our lives.

Jesus responds to their grumbling not by retracting His statement but by reinforcing it, emphasizing that no one can come to Him unless drawn by the Father. This teaches us about the mystery of faith – it is a gift from God. Our ability to believe and accept Jesus as the Bread of Life is not something we achieve on our own but is initiated and nurtured by God's grace. Jesus then makes a profound declaration: "I am the bread of life." This statement is rich in meaning. Bread, a staple food, symbolizes sustenance and life. By referring to Himself as the bread of life, Jesus is saying that He is essential for our spiritual sustenance and eternal life. Just as bread sustains physical life, Jesus, the living bread, sustains our spiritual life.

Jesus offers a promise that those who believe in Him will have eternal life. He contrasts the manna eaten by the Israelites in the desert, which sustained them temporarily, with the living bread that grants eternal life. This is a call for us to move beyond seeking temporary satisfaction and to hunger for the eternal nourishment that only Christ can provide. This passage also points us towards the Eucharist, the source and summit of our Christian life. In the Eucharist, we partake in the body and blood of Christ, receiving the spiritual nourishment that strengthens us on our journey towards eternal life. It is a profound mystery of our faith where Jesus gives Himself to us, transforming us and drawing us closer to Him.

As we reflect on this Gospel passage, let us ask ourselves: Are we open to the grace of God drawing us to Jesus, the Bread of Life? Do we seek the eternal nourishment that He offers, or are we content with the temporary satisfactions of this world? Let us deepen our faith in Jesus, who came down from heaven to give us life, and let us approach the Eucharist with renewed devotion, recognizing it as the true bread that sustains us unto eternal life. May we, like the disciples, choose to stay with Jesus, believing that He has the words of eternal life and that He Himself is the living bread that satisfies our deepest hunger. Amen.



Heavenly Father, we come before You with grateful hearts, acknowledging Your grace that draws us to Your Son, Jesus Christ. We thank You for the gift of faith, which allows us to recognize Jesus as the Bread of Life, the living bread that came down from heaven to give us eternal life. Lord Jesus, we praise You for Your profound declaration that You are the bread of life. Just as bread sustains our physical bodies, we seek the nourishment that only You can provide for our souls. Help us to move beyond the temporary satisfactions of this world and to hunger for the eternal sustenance that comes from You alone.

Holy Spirit, open our hearts and minds to the mystery of the Eucharist. As we partake in the body and blood of Christ, may we be transformed and drawn closer to Him. Strengthen us on our journey of faith and guide us to live in a way that reflects the love and grace we receive from the Bread of Life.

Father, we ask for the grace to remain open to Your call, to seek Jesus with renewed devotion, and to deepen our faith in Him each day. May we, like the disciples, choose to stay with Jesus, believing that He has the words of eternal life and that He Himself is the living bread that satisfies our deepest hunger.

In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen.
