

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord:

"He Emptied Himself for Us"



On this Palm Sunday, we stand at the threshold of Holy Week, holding palm branches in our hands as symbols of both triumph and tragedy. The Gospel of St. Luke (22:14–23:56) presents us with the full drama of Jesus' Passion—a movement from the Upper Room to Calvary, from the breaking of bread to the breaking of His body on the cross. It is a story marked not only by betrayal, suffering, and death, but also by profound love, mercy, and self-emptying.

Jesus begins the Passion narrative with a gift—His very self—in the institution of the Eucharist. "This is my body, which is given for you." These words are not only the heart of the Last Supper, but the key to understanding the whole Passion. Jesus gives everything—His dignity, His strength, His breath, and finally His life—not for His own sake, but for ours. In a world where power is grasped and defended, Jesus shows us a different way: the way of surrender, of servant-love, of self-sacrifice

St. Luke's account highlights this with the image of the innocent Lamb who suffers without retaliation. As Jesus is betrayed by Judas, denied by Peter, and condemned by the very people He came to save, He remains rooted in compassion. On the cross, He prays not for vengeance but for mercy: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." Even in agony, He consoles a repentant criminal: "Today you will be with me in paradise." In the face of cruelty, He offers kindness; in the midst of abandonment, He remains faithful.

We are invited today not just to witness the Passion but to enter it. Who are we in this story? Are we like the disciples, who fall asleep or flee in fear? Like Peter, who denies under pressure? Like the crowd, who shifts from "Hosanna!" to "Crucify Him!" in a matter of days? Yet even when we fail, Jesus does not give up on us. He meets us in our weakness and calls us to walk with Him, to carry our crosses with love, and to trust in the victory that comes through the cross.

Palm Sunday reminds us that God's power is revealed not in domination, but in self-giving love. Christ emptied Himself for us so that we might be filled with His grace. As we begin this sacred week, let us fix our eyes on Jesus, follow Him closely in His Passion, and prepare our hearts for the joy of the Resurrection.

Prayer: He Emptied Himself for Us



Lord Jesus, as we begin this Holy Week, we walk with You in the shadow of the cross, our hearts heavy with the weight of Your suffering and our hands holding palm branches—symbols of praise, yet also of paradox.

You gave Yourself completely for us.

In the Upper Room, You offered Your Body and Blood; on Calvary, You poured out Your mercy.

Teach us to recognize Your love in every step of the Passion—

in betrayal, in silence, in forgiveness, in death.

When we are tempted to run away in fear, stay with us.

When we deny You in our words or actions, look at us with the same gaze of mercy that restored Peter. Help us to carry our crosses, not with bitterness, but with trust—knowing that every act of love, every sacrifice offered in union with You, leads not to death, but to new life.

Lord, may Your self-giving love transform our hearts. Teach us to empty ourselves for others

as You emptied Yourself for us.
We pray this in Your holy name. Amen.

OUR FACINATING FAITH: LENT

One of the liturgical reforms mandated at the 2nd Vatican Council was that the focus of the season of Lent should be restored as a time of preparation for—or renewal of—baptism. The bishops at the Council were aware of the fact that the origins of Lent as distinctive liturgical season lay in the early centuries when the Church celebrated the sacraments of Christina initiation only once a year, at the Easter Vigil. In order to prepare those who were to receive those sacraments, a special period of preparation gradually developed. By the time of Second Vatican Council, the initiatory character of Lent had long been forgotten, and it had become simply a time of penance focused on individual spiritual renewal. The introduction of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and the revision of the Lectionary after the Council have changed all of that. Now the Sunday scripture readings during the Lent are very carefully selected with an eye to the journey of those preparing to be initiated at the Easter Vigil.
